

PREK TNAOT

A CONSERVATION OF THE GRACIOUS PINK DOLPHIN

Surrounded by 275 hectares of natural mangroves and abundant fish and wildlife resources, Prek Tnaot serves as a local conservation area for the Irrawaddy River, commonly known as the Pink Dolphin. This endangered species has recently returned to the Prek Tnaot River, indicating a healthy habitat and unpolluted waters. Led by a team from Marine Conservation Cambodia (MCC), alongside Kampot provincial fishery officials and local community members, the area has recently become a model for responsible tourism in Kampot. The pink dolphins are an endangered species in Southeast Asia, found in Myanmar, Thailand, and Cambodia, with only a few thousand remaining. The MCC has implemented various methods to support the well-being and growth of the dolphins, including placing concrete boxes in the sea. These boxes provide a safe space for the dolphins to breed and help to reduce illegal or accidental captures, resulting in fifteen pink dolphins successfully returning to the river. This symbolic gesture underscores the resilience and determination of the local community in preserving the pink dolphins and their habitat.

Our ongoing commitment includes three key initiatives:



Allocating 20% of revenue through booked room packages and redefining the recreational activities, all designed to promote marine conservation.

Donating 20 advanced fish nursery blocks in protected areas to effectively combat illegal fishing practices.



Located 30 minutes to the southwest of Kampot, Kep is a local village renowned for its legendary crab cuisine. In collaboration with local fishermen and the government, Kep Market is hard to miss, with its reputation as one of the most significant landmarks in the area. Visitors are encouraged to try the delicacies while witnessing a stunning sunset from Kep. Prior to arriving in Kep, one should visit the Kampot Salt Fields, where salt is produced using inherited ancient techniques that impart an earthy sensation to its crystals. These efforts inspire other provinces to maximise their abundant resources, ensuring sustainability and benefiting the local community.
